Experience

Secured an important ruling, in conjunction with co-counsel, from the Pennsylvania Commonwealth Court on behalf of the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center (UPMC) in a highly publicized and longrunning dispute with Highmark Inc. and Pennsylvania's Attorney General. At issue was whether consent decrees to maintain in-network access for Highmark insureds at UPMC facilities should be extended, and the court ruled that the expiration date should be upheld. This ruling led to renewed negotiation, ultimately an agreement between the parties, and the withdrawal of all related lawsuits by the Commonwealth.
