The home was already functional when the nonprofit learned it was not properly zoned. A small but vocal group of neighbors tried to use the need for zoning relief as an excuse to close the facility. Bob filed the application with the Zoning Board of Adjustment (ZBA) and undertook direct community organizing and outreach. He addressed misconceptions and rallied enough support such that, in the end, the original objectors wrote a letter of support to the ZBA, which granted the variance. Bob is also active with Philadelphia VIP and works through its Tangled Title program to help low-income residents clear legal titles to their homes and assist with zoning and permitting issues.

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
